

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In the early 20th century, rural mail carriers who purchased automobiles for their routes learned quickly that their new cars were often no match for deep snow.

In 1906, Virgil White began converting automobiles into snowmobiles by replacing the front tires with skis and the rear tires with caterpillar treads, allowing the vehicle to move easily over snow and ice. The attachment, name Snowbird, saved carriers the expense of purchasing and maintaining a horse and sled for winter deliveries. After the Model T's popularity made it the go-to car of the early 20th century, White began manufacturing Ford Model T kits. At left, you can see a 1921 Model T ford with the Snowbird attachment fitted.

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ROB'S BIT The passing of Bob Page

Rob thought we might enjoy one of his earlier pieces, here reprinted from an old edition of the magazine – Ed

I had the experience of attending the funeral of one of Pomona's pioneers. Bob Page moved to Pomona with his family in 1919 and passed away at his home on Summit Road in 2009. His father was Herbert Page, known as Blue Shirt Page, or just 'Bluey.' Bluey started making furniture and acquired the Ford agency and sold Model Ts.

When World War Two broke out, some of the boys from Pomona enlisted, including Bob and George Page and Stan Shafer. They never got out of Brisband and were known as Queen Street Commandos. Bob was interested in motor vehicles, especially Fords, so he got a job working on army trucks, jeeps, and ducks.

When the war was finished, Bob planned to take over the Ford Dealership from his father and build new premises. While in Brisbane he pegged out his new building on some land and when he had to test-drive a truck he would drive out to see if it would fit into the shed.

He ran a successful garage right up into the Eighties, selling not only cars, trucks and tractors but also Southern Cross products including pumps, engines and lawn mowers. Bob also had the RACQ smash repairs and roadside service. Besides running his business, Bob was involved in local organisations such as the Fire Brigade board, Show Society, and Rotary.

My Dad and the Page boys went to school together in the 1930s and remained friends for the rest of their lives. Several fishing and camping trips were enjoyed together. One trip they went right up to Cape York across the Jardeen River.

Rob also supplied this photo and Lawrie Pashley gave him some information to share.

This Ford Sierra R.S. 500 Cosworth 1989 won Bathurst and was driven by Johnson and Bowe.
