Helping Others

LifeFlight used to be called CareFlight. It is a world leader in aero-medical care and Australia's most diversified service with both a fixed and rotary wing fleet.



LifeFlight helps seriously ill and injured patients around Australia and the world to quickly get the medical care they need. From rapid response, to inter-facility transfers, their team of more than 400 staff members, including aviation crew, support staff, and over 100 doctors are a lifeline to vulnerable individuals.

Across Australia LifeFlight doctors attend to more than 10 patients a day.

As a leading Australian charity, LifeFlight operates 13 rescue helicopters and three air ambulance jets across 12 locations. Eight of these are LifeFlight's own aeromedical bases. LifeFlight also assists Retrieval Services Queensland with doctors, when required, on fixed wing aeromedical services, including inter-hospital patient transfers performed by the Royal Flying Doctor Service to and from regional centres such as Brisbane, Bundaberg and Townsville.

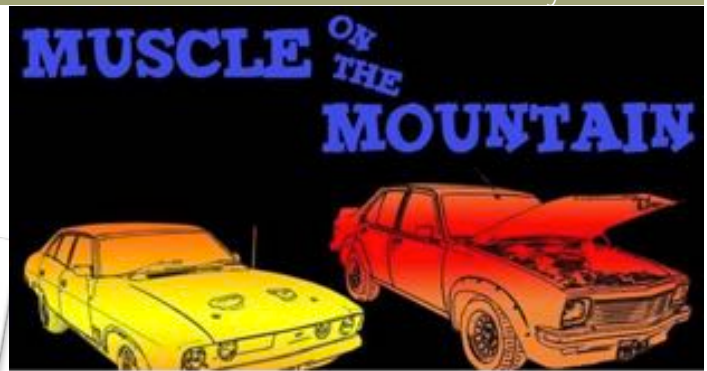
The staff are specially trained in pre-hospital retrieval medicine through LifeFlight's internationally recognised training academy.

LifeFlight has flown 45,000 critical rescue missions over the past 36 years.

Serving both the community and industry clients, LifeFlight operates a charitable service and 'profit for purpose' commercial enterprises that help fund our charitable activity. Surplus profit from our social enterprises are used to make sure our community helicopters remain on standby 24 hours a day, everyday of the year.

It is wonderful to know that some of the funds raised through our members' hard work at the car show have gone to supporting such a worthy cause.

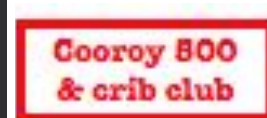

“ANZAC Day 2017”



After ten years of blood, sweat and tears, my dream came true. Driving the wrong way in Mary Street with my ninety-seven year old uncle in the 1942 Ford Jeep. I didn't used to know a lot about Jeeps but things have changed now.



I remember years ago when I was in Junior Farmers. I had driven to Gympie one night, but the meeting I was supposed to go to had been cancelled; so I'd decided to go to the pictures. The theatre was opposite the Town Hall. "Kissin' Cousins" was the film; and it featured Elvis Presley driving a Jeep along a mountain road, singing "Blue Misty Mountains."

Harold Bazzo built a servo in Pomona in the fifties, which was next to the Majestic Theatre. He needed a vehicle for running errands around town. He got a Jeep and stripped it down to the last nut and bolt. I saw him out in the paddock painting the chassis; and it wasn't long before he had it going, hooning around town in top gear, as fast as possible.

The body of my Jeep came from Aramac, a country town west of Rockhampton. Most Jeeps around here were used to go fishing on the beach. That salt water was bad news for vehicles.

Arthur Spickett had a Jeep on his Louisville farm for fifty years. I didn't get his Jeep but did get a truckload of spare parts from him. Many people helped on the journey of restoring my Jeep, including my neighbour Shane. He loves playing with old vehicles but his is not as old as mine.
