The King of The Mountain at Pomona - Cliff Watson has booked with Heather Manders to have our cars on display at on Sunday 24 July.




**Repairs to the Club House** - Cliff Watson has put a light on sign and installed new security lights. Thank you Cliff from all the Club members.

The first movie I ever saw at the cinema was "Chitty Chitty Bang Bang" - that iconic film about a magical car that could fly and swim; but only recently have I discovered that the car was based on a real-life vehicle.

The eccentric British Count Louis Zborowski happened to be a racing car driver and auto engineer. It was he who designed (and drove) three outrageous-looking vehicles named Chitty Bang Bang I, II and III, which were all powered by surplus World War I aero engines. Chitty I had a pre-war Mercedes chassis and a Maybach aero engine of around 23,000cc (about 10 times the displacement of my little Kia Rio.) The exposed pushrods and rockers actuated four valves for each of the engine's six cylinders, producing about 300 hp. In 1921, at Brooklands, the car lapped at more than 113mph (182kph.)

Chitty II was used for touring and Chitty III as a baggage vehicle. Sadly, none of the three had wings or a rudder – that was left to Ian Fleming to invent and to be made into the movie I loved.

While most people thought the name came from the horrific noise the engine made at idle, it was actually a nod to the lyrics from a bawdy Royal Flying Corps ballad.

#### May 2016



This month I'm not going to mention the word 'car', but talk about something completely different. I lived on a farm from 1944 to 1979 and in that time I learned about nature, growing plants, and raising animals.

So much satisfaction and delight comes from growing things yourself. You go out into your own garden and pick food to eat. You hear people talk about 'fresh is best'. Well, fresh is your own garden.

Sometimes with home grown you have problems with soil suitability, pests, disease, weather conditions like too much water or too dry, too hot or too cold.

My garden is not a pretty one, but it produces. I don't believe in forcing your plants with artificial fertilisers as you lose the flavor and goodness from the food. I call myself a 'low pressure gardener'; that is, getting what you can with the minimum amount of fuss. On the other hand, my neighbor just through the fence is a 'high pressure gardener.' He buys sugarcane mulch and fertilisers like blood and bone, sulphur of potash, and Dolomite. If a plant is not performing it gets the chop. He buys and reads gardening books and even 'phones the ABC gardening programs with all sorts of questions about gardening. Yet when I visit I always take my produce – like monsterio, choko, pumpkin, passionfruit and bananas.

One of the most important things is to pick your produce at the right time or it will be lost. We find with paw-paw that as soon as we see a slight yellowing we pick the fruit and ripen them inside – otherwise the birds and possums will get them first.

It's always interesting to try growing something different. Jane gave me some plants of Arrowroot, which can be grated onto a meal to give it a nice flavor. Alex gave me some ginger, so I am learning that it is difficult to know when to dig some and/or prepare it for eating.
