The above photo was shared to the club's Facebook page by our illustrious president Cliff Watson. My first thought was "What on Earth?" (Well, I cleaned that up a bit for the newsletter, but you get my drift.) I decided to research what was going on, and found a video. This photo is a still shot from that video. It came with the following explanation:

"What a spectacle! Thanks to the fine folks at Australia's National Film and Sound Archive (NFSA) we have the privilege of witnessing quite an event, a motorcycle chariot race that was staged at the NSW Police Force Carnival held at the Sydney Showground in early 1936. The rare footage comes from Movietone News, March 7, 1936, and showcases two men starring their twin Harley-Davidson powered chariots around the track. A featured stunt of engineering and guts, these motorcycle chariot races took place in countries around the world in the 1920's and 1930's in a variety of configurations, sometimes utilizing as many as four motorcycles per chariot. What a sight this must have been."

Orange Sky Laundry was one of the six beneficiaries of proceeds from the 2016 Cooroy Car Show & Swap Meet.

Orange Sky Laundry is the world's first free mobile laundry service for the homeless. It began with a crazy idea, in 2014, to put two washing machines and two dryers in a van and wash and dry clothes for free. Starting in the streets of Brisbane, Orange Sky has now grown to 11 services across Australia in Brisbane, Canberra, Gold Coast, Melbourne, Sydney, Sunshine Coast, Perth, Adelaide, SE Melbourne, Wollongong and Hobart. Orange Sky Laundry now does over 6.9 tonnes of laundry every week.

However, perhaps even more important than clean clothes, Orange Sky provides homeless and disadvantaged Australians with over 1,300 hours of positive and genuine conversations every week.

This fantastic charity was also on hand to help those devastated by Ex-Tropical Cyclone Debbie, completing 2 1/2 tonnes of laundry in three days.

What an AWESOME set-up!! It's heart-warming to see the efforts put into the car show going a small way to help.

GOOMERI PUMPKIN FESTIVAL

During the 1990s, Goomeri, like many other rural areas, was in a time of prolonged drought and water shortages. Farmers and local businesses were doing it tough and morale was at an all time low.



A town meeting was held to discuss ideas for improving the town's morale and lagging business economy. At the meeting, one of the ideas was to have a festival of some kind. As pumpkins had been traditionally grown in the area over a number of years, the idea of a Pumpkin Festival was born.

A small group of enthusiastic supporters banded together to organize the first festival. Amidst cries of, 'It'll never work', 'I've never heard such a silly idea!' and so on, the committee forged ahead and the first festival was held. The fun part of the festival was to have people rolling pumpkins down a hill. The idea of rolling pumpkins down a hill was so way out that it was appealing and thus the Great Australian Pumpkin Roll was born and Policeman's Hill got its name.

The purpose of the festival was to bring people and money into our town's flagging economy and to extend country hospitality to the visitors whom we hoped to attract. And, attract them we did! The first festival had an attendance of approximately 1000 and was a raging success. There were 71 pumpkin rollers and the Great Australian Pumpkin Roll had made its mark in the history of the town. Local business owners were encouraged to open their doors for the festival and take advantage of the increased population as a result.

Goomeri was on a roll! The 1997 success provided the incentive for the committee to continue with another festival in 1998 as more people were willing to become involved. The town had received a well needed boost which we needed to capitalize on. Goomeri had shown what a little initiative and daring could do – we took a risk and it paid off big time!

The Goomeri Pumpkin Festival has continued to grow each year since 1997, to the extent where it has received state, national and international recognition. The Great Australian Pumpkin Roll[™] has continued to grow and, in 2009, there were over 600 Pumpkin Rollers sending their pumpkins racing, splattering and hurtling down Policeman's Hill. Policeman's Hill (named so because the Police Station is at the bottom) has become a tourist attraction in its own right as people come to see where these pumpkins roll.

The festival has expanded over the years to include many more pumpkin based competitions including Pumpkin Bowls, Decorated Pumpkins, Giant Pumpkin competition, Pumpkin Pull, Pumpkin Pageant, Pumpkin Quilt Challenge, Decorated Tea Towel Competition and the Pumpkin Power Shot Put.

Add to these events the many market stalls, the Heritage and Outback Street Parade, whip cracking, Working Dog Displays, horsemanship displays, roving entertainment and great pumpkin food, and you have a family friendly, entry free event for everyone to enjoy.
