1936 Stainless Steel Ford

In 1935, officials at Allegheny Ludlum Steel Division and the Ford Motor Company collaborated on an experiment that would become a legacy and a tribute to one of the most dynamic metals ever developed.

Allegheny Ludlum, a pioneer producer of stainless steel, proposed the idea of creating a stainless steel car to Ford. The idea took shape in the form of a 1936 Deluxe Sedan. That car became the centerpiece of a campaign to expose the public to the new metal and its many uses.



This is the 1936 Ford Tudor Sedan built for and owned by Allegheny Ludlum Steel. This is one of only four in existence, and is the only one currently in running and roadworthy condition.

The jaw-dropping beauty offered here is one of that tiny production run. The car is in exceptional condition, with the interior and even the frame looking great. All four cars each had over 200,000 miles on them before they removed them from service.

These cars were built for Allegheny as promotional and marketing projects. The top salesmen each year were given the honour of being able to drive them for one year. The V-8 engine (max 85 hp) ran like a sewing machine and was surprisingly smooth and quiet.



The dies were ruined by stamping the stainless car parts, making these the last of these cars ever produced.

The only privately owned example, it won two trophies at the Early V8 Club Auburn 2009 event, first place at the 2009 Hershey AACA event and was nominated for the 2009 AACA Car of the Year.

It was recently restored by Lon Kruger, one of the world's best restorers.



The car utilizes the standard 221/85 HP flathead mated to a 3-speed manual and working Columbia overdrive, and has been driven just 18 miles since its restoration.

No costs were mentioned here!



Effie Update

This is my current project. A 1979 Ford F100 4X4 that I purchased about three years ago. It needs a lot of work but the current task is replacing the worn uni joints in the front draft shaft and axles.



First job was removing the free wheeling hubs. The left side was especially difficult as the drive gear refused to come out.

A steering wheel puller finally got it out. Then I discovered it was missing a few pieces. The photo shows the right hub at the top and the left hub below.



The drive gear was still on the vehicle when this photo was taken, but as you can see it's missing the Cam Body ring, inner clutch gear ring and coil spring. So it looks like she'll be getting new free wheeling hubs!

Next job was removing the brake disc assembly and bearings. The lock nuts were quite loose on both sides so probably just need adjusting. However I've already purchased brand new bearings so will throw them in anyway.



Finally the axles could be removed and I could measure the uni joints and order new ones.

This weekend I will be removing the old uni joints from the axles in preparation, then waiting for the new parts to arrive.

The following is an extract from the Queensland Government **Special Interest Vehicle Concession Scheme Guide**:

An impromptu event is an event that has been initiated by club member, involves one or more vehicles, and must comply with the following elements:

- Involves an invitation to wider club members to attend the event; and is either
 - Endorsed in advance of the event by the relevant club or Australia Street Rod Federation committee; or,
 - where it exists, complies with published club guidelines as to what is a valid event; and
- is listed either in the newsletter, on the website, or social media page (or in another manner approved by the club or Australia Street Rod Federation, such as the club calendar of events) prior to the event.

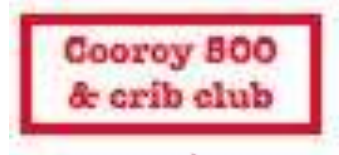
