



Julian's first car is pictured at top right. It was an EH Holden in Saltbush Green. He was in 2nd form (now known as Year 9.) At 14 years old, he used the car to drive to school. One day, the principal told him not to drive "that car" to school any more, so Julian obliged by driving his mum's car to school the following day! He figured there was more than one way to skin a cat! That car started his love affair with EHs; and his current count is seven.

Julian loved Brock Commodores because they had "body by Holden, soul by Brock"; and could easily outrun Highway Patrol Cars! So, at 21, he got his first new car— a VH SS Brock Commodore. At 23 he traded it in for a VK Calais director, which was in turn traded, when he was 25, for a VL SS Group A. He ended up hating the VL and got rid of it after only 7 months, replacing it with a 1969 Z-28 Camaro that he kept for 20 years.

Julian's claim to fame is that he once owned the HR Premier wagon, pictured at right, which he bought from Ben Ely, the Head Man of the band "Regurgitator".





ROB'S BIT

"The beginning of the 1924 Dodge Saga"




You have probably thought, "Why is he so mad about a 1924 Dodge?" Well, it all started back in 1935 when Dad's uncle, who was also called Rob Davies, died and left his Dodge to my father.

Being only eleven years old, the car was in pretty good order. I do have a photo taken about that time.

It wasn't long before Dad modified the Dodge into a utility, as many did in those times.

During the war years petrol was very scarce, so Dad built a gas producer or charcoal burner to continue on motoring.

The Dodge served Dad well during his courting years. Mum, at that time, was playing the piano accordion in the "Black and white dance band." Dad would go to the dances and, by carrying some musical gear into the hall, would get in for nix.





They used to talk about going home from the dances in the early mornings with the frost all around; no air conditioners in the Dodge – overcoats were popular back then!

Mum and Dad were married in 1940 and set out on their honeymoon in the Dodge. It was an epic journey for those days, on mostly gravel roads. Leaving Gympie they headed north over Bells Bridge and through the South Burnett to Kingaroy, then on over to Bell and back through Toowoomba to Brisbane; and of course home to Pomona. I on't know how long it took but probably several days.
